

Richard A. Kammerer, PhD

Richard Kammerer is a group leader at the Paul Scherrer Institute in Switzerland (see <https://www.psi.ch/lbr>).

Richard Kammerer started his career at the Biozentrum of the University of Basel in Switzerland where he obtained a Dipl. Phil. in Biochemistry (1992), a Ph.D. in Biochemistry (1996) and a University lecturer degree (Habilitation, 2000).

In August 2000, Richard Kammerer took up a post as a Wellcome Trust Career Development Fellow at the Wellcome Trust Centre for Cell-Matrix Research of the University of Manchester, United Kingdom. In 2004 he was awarded a Wellcome Trust Senior Research Fellowship Basic Biomedical Science and in 2007 he was promoted to Reader (Associate Professor). In 2010, Richard Kammerer moved to the Paul Scherrer Institute in Switzerland where he heads the Applied Molecular Biology Group.

Richard Kammerer collaborates with industrial and academic partners on applied research projects that are critically dependent on the availability of high-quality recombinant proteins. In addition, he works on proteins that are of medical relevance and therefore are of interest for applied research. They include botulinum neurotoxins and their receptors, G protein-coupled receptors (GPCRs), and several bacterial/eukaryotic membrane proteins.
