

Marie-Helene Marion, MD

Dr. Marie-Helene Marion is a medical graduate from the University of Paris who specialized in movement disorders in London (1981;1984-1986) with late Professor David Marsden. She pioneered in France the use of Botulinum toxin injections in Neurology and in particular for the jaw and larynx.

She moved back to UK in 1999 to work for 12 years as a consultant neurologist, running the movement disorder unit at St George's Hospital in London. She now works part time in the ENT department on the Botulinum toxin treatment of voice, swallowing and breathing dystonic disorders, as well as injecting deep neck muscles for the treatment of antecollis.

She is the director of the London BTX centre and the chair of the British Neurotoxin Network, which gathers neurologists in UK, running Botulinum toxin clinics. She is a medical adviser for the UK dystonia society and blogs for patients with dystonia (www.infodystonia.com)
